The Australian National University is ranked as Australian's top university and 19th in the world, in the 2015 QS World University Rankings. It is recognised as one of the world's leading centres for teaching and research. The Crawford School of Public Policy is the University's graduate public policy school serving and influencing Australia, Asia and the Pacific through education and policy research. Many graduates have become people of influence in their chosen fields. Notable alumni include an Australian federal minister, a prime minister of the Solomon Islands, a minister for finance in Indonesia, an alternate director at the Asian Development Bank (ADB), university presidents, e.g. the current President of the National Economics University of Vietnam.

Program information

Taught by renowned professors, the Crawford School's economics program gives students a world-class education in applied economics. It has two streams: International and Development Economics, and Environmental and Resource Economics.

The Master of International and Development Economics is designed to develop skills in four areas: technical skills; engagement in key debates related to current issues in international and development economics; application of technical skills to real-world problems; and communication skills. It is for people wishing to follow careers in international trade, growth and finance; banking, monetary policy and economic development; quantitative methods and economic modelling; and business development and economic policy in a market economy.

The Master of Environmental and Resource Economics seeks to develop skills in quantitative analysis and modelling, and to provide an understanding of economic approaches to resolving the challenges of natural resource and environmental management. Graduates will have the competencies to work in areas such as environmental and climate change modelling, fisheries management, water planning and management, environmental resources policy and sustainable development.

NEU and ANU – combined degree

This program will see students complete one or two semesters (depending on your previous degree) of graduate studies in a relevant field at the National Economics University (NEU).

On the successful completion of this graduate study with an average grade of 70 per cent, or higher, students will be granted entry into the ANU Crawford School to study another year for one of the Nominated Degrees.

Professor Tran Tho Dat

President, National Economics University

Dr Tran Tho Dat joined the National Economics University (NEU), Hanoi, Vietnam in 1982 and became the President in 2014. Being one of the national key and

research – led universities of Vietnam, the NEU is leading in the field of economics, management and business in Vietnam. Throughout his 34-year career as a university lecturer and professor, he has taught content that ranged from the statistics to economics. Dr Dat is also active in economic consulting, particularly in the higher education financing issues, monetary policy and economic stabilisation for organizations and government.

In an administrative capacity, he has served as the Manager of World Bank Higher Education Project in Vietnam in the year 1999, Director of Education Management Department and then Graduate School for 5 years in 2003-2008, and as Vice President from 2008 to September 2014, then President now.

Prof. Dat received a Bachelor of Economics degree from the NEU in 1982, a Ph.D in Statistics from the NEU in 1991, a Master of Economics of Development degree from the Australian National University in 1995, and a Ph.D in Economics from the Australian National University in 2000. His research interests include higher education financing, credit markets, economic growth models, quality of growth, education and growth, demand for money and monetary policy, economics of climate change.



Muhamad Chatib Basri Indonesian economist

He was the Minister of Finance in the Second United Indonesia Cabinet between 21 May 2013 and 20 October 2014. Before his appointment as Minister of Finance he was Chair of the Indonesian Investment

Coordinating Board (Badan Kordinasi Penanaman Modal, or BKPM).

Dr Basri has a master degree (MIDEC) and PhD from the Australian National University. He also teaches in the Faculty of Economics at the University of Indonesia (FEUI) and was Director of the Lembaga Penyelidikan Ekonomi dan Masyarakat (Institute for Economic and Social Research, or LPEM) within the FEUI and Ash Centre Senior Fellow at the Harvard Kennedy School 2015-2016. He is also upcoming fellow at the Centre on Global Transformation University of California at San Diego. His areas of expertise include international trade, macroeconomics, and political economy. As an academic economist he has published in various economic journals such as World Economy, Asian Economic Papers, and the Bulletin of Indonesian Economic Studies. He is currently an adjunct fellow in the Arndt-Corden Department of Economics at the Crawford School.
